Chair and Vice Chair Report June 2021

This past year has seen several changes for the Parish Council. We bade a fond farewell to some Councillors and welcomed both new and returning Councillors. Cllr Cathy Harber took over as Chair of the Parish Council in April and Cllr Penny Pringle was elected as Vice Chair in May.

Cllr Alan Craddock, to whom the Parish owes a great deal of gratitude, stepped down from his position as Chair of the Parish Council in April. Cllr Craddock has worked tirelessly over the past few years for the Parish, being instrumental in a number of the improvements such as work to improve Thealby Play Area and the Burton Playing Field, the refurbishment of the Parish Office, the new signage at Burton and Thealby and the improved noticeboards throughout all three villages, amongst many other projects. He certainly deserves a period of rest and recuperation!!

One of Cllr Craddock's last tasks was to appoint a Grounds Maintenance Operative, Michael Lonsdale. You may have seen him busily working away around the Parish as he begins to settle into his new role, even though he is still awaiting some of his equipment.

The Parish Council secured a grant from Grange Wind Farm to replace the benches on the Flixborough Road/Barnston Way junction and on the Paddock. The memorial plaques are being kept safe and will be reinstalled once the benches are in place. Todds Lane is due to be resurfaced at long last in June. This has largely been made possible by securing a grant from the North Lincs Community Grant Fund which covers 80% of the cost, with the remaining 20% needing to be funded separately.

We are very excited about the construction of the path from Burton to Thealby which is nearing completion. This has been a long-awaited project, requested by residents to the Parish Council, to allow safe pedestrian access between the villages of Burton and Thealby. The path will stop just before Thealby, at which point the Normanby Estate have agreed to pedestrian use of the track which runs behind Thealby and joins up with Normanby Road. The Parish Council are very grateful to see this idea come to fruition with the efforts of the Ward Councillors and the funding from North Lincolnshire Council.

Some residents have expressed concern about the renewal of the lease for Burton Hills from Normanby Estate. The lease expired in 2020 and the Estate indicated there were no problems with renewal, but the Parish Council are still waiting for the correct document from the Estate. This is an ongoing issue that the Parish Council are eager to resolve as quickly as possible.

Finally, the Parish Council were delighted to be able to hold the Annual Parish Meeting face-to-face in the Village Hall this year. We are very hopeful that the road out of lockdown continues and that some kind of normality can be resumed.

BURTON UPON STATHER VILLAGE HALL REPORT

What a difference a few months makes! At the time of writing the Hall has already welcomed back one group, the Toddler group, and this week marks the return of most other groups. We are all extremely excited to welcome back our hirers, in a Covid-secure environment. Hopefully we will not have to close again and the steps out of lockdown will continue.

The Committee have been working very hard throughout the lockdown period to ensure the Hall remains safe and ready for hirers to return. This past year has not been easy, and I am personally very grateful to all Committee members for volunteering their time and working together as a team for the benefit of the Hall.

The Hall has secured two grants in recent months. The FCC Communities Foundation have awarded a grant of £3529.12 to fund the installation of a new fire alarm system. Work on this began on 13th May and is due to be completed by 18th May. We are extremely grateful for this grant as the new fire alarm system will give greater protection to preserve the Village Hall. All being well we will never have to use the system, but it is nice to know it is there if we need it!

The other grant secured was from the Tesco Carrier Bag Fund which awarded the Hall £1000. This money is being split between the match funding for the fire alarm system and the installation of new sinks in the ladies' toilets.

Looking ahead, the Village Hall Committee have set the date for the Christmas Fayre – 4th December. We very much hope this will go ahead, and that the community can come together to enjoy the festive spirit. ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY

Welcome to our section where we look back in time to see what our Parish Council of yesteryear were doing. This issue brings us the minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 4th May 1959. These minutes were handwritten into the minute book during the meeting – no mean feat! These are the last handwritten minutes in the book.

Minutes of Meeting held in the County School on the 4th May, 1959 W. H. Barnes. Esq. Presiding.

- Apology for Absence received from Major Sheffield which was accepted.
- Matters arising out of Minutes.
 Clerk's Filing Cabinet. Resolved that this matter be placed on the Agenda for next meeting.
 - Typist Miss Hall: The council expressed their pleasure in connection with the lay-out and typing of minutes. Proposed and seconded that the sum of seven shillings and sixpence be paid monthly for this service.
- 3. Burton Hills Loan. Resolved that this matter be placed on the Agenda for consideration by new council.
- 4. Ironstone Working: Flixborough & Burton Stather.
 - (a) Council members were unable to attend preliminary meeting held in Council Chambers on 30th April 1959.
 - (b) Two council members will attend the informal conference to be held at 11:30am on Monday 11th May 1959. (Glanford Brigg R.D.C. to be notified of their proposed attendance).
- County Highways and Footpaths Maintenance. Proposed and seconded that Glanford Brigg R.D.C. be notified of the following:-

Highways -

- (a) South side of Darby Road running east from Vicarage Crescent. The camber of the shoulder is too great causing the rear of modern cars to bottom as they enter drive-way.
- (b) Darby Rd. Northside from 'Peacehaven' running eastwards. Shoulder breaking away.
- (c) The Avenue from Flixborough Road end to Normanby surface badly fretted and corrugated by bulldozer during snow-ploughing operations.

Footpaths -

- (a) Flixborough Rd. East to West on Southside.
- (b) High Street East side from Co-operative to bus shelter too much cross fall.
- (c) From Nurses Cottage towards Vicarage too much cross fall and tree roots.
- (d) Stather Hill general repairs.
- (e) Darby Rd. from Vicarage to Tee Lane surface cracking and general repair.
- (f) Tee Lane to Thealby entire length.
- (g) Villages of Normanby and Thealby inspection of Highways and Footpaths invited by Glanford Brigg R.D.C. Engineer.
- Proposed and seconded that the name and address of Mrs Forrest, High St., Burton-on-Stather, President of the Women's Institute be forwarded to the Organising Secretary of the Lindsey Soc. For the Welfare of the Handicapped.
- 7. Street Lighting. Letter to be sent to R.D.C. with reference to the lighting arrangements for the 1959 season and the proposed additional lights. The council hope that the development taking place on Darby Rd., and Tee Lane will be taken into account before final siting takes place.
- 8. Telephone Calls Chairman Proposed and seconded that the Chairman be reimbursed for telephone calls and correspondence expenses.

9. Notice of Meetings. Resolved that a Notice of Meeting be forwarded to Mrs Green – Caretaker c/o Burton Junior School.

10. Accounts:

Proposed and seconded that the sum of £3.9.6 be paid to Major Sheffield – re Allotment Rents.

- 11. Bungalows Old People. Letter from Major Sheffield read by Chairman in connection with allocation of bungalows. The council agreed that this was a worthy list.
- 12. Water Softening Plant. The Council expressed concern in connection with the date of the operation.
- 13. Precepts Money. Proposed and seconded that a letter be forwarded to F. Crowther – Treasurer for R.D.C,, requesting date of availability of money.
- 14. Final Meeting of Council. The Chairman thanked all council members for their support and keen interest in the affairs of Burton upon Stather, Thealby and Normanby.
- 15. Councillors Present W.H. Barnes, Esq., S. Kitchinson, E. Markham, Esq., and G. W. Robinson.


